OF PARTICIPANTS IN THE EDUCATIONAL PROCESS
FOR PARTICIPATION IN ACADEMIC MOBILITY PROGRAMS

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1. General regulations

1.1 The Regulations on the procedure for competitive selection of participants in the educational process for participation in academic mobility programs at Khmelnytskyi National University (hereinafter - the Regulations) are developed in accordance with the current Laws of Ukraine "On Education", "On Higher Education" (as amended), the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine of 12.08.2015 № 579 "On Approval of the Regulations on the Procedure for Exercising the Right to Academic Mobility" (as amended by the Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine of 13.05.2022 № 599), the Order of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine "Procedure for Recognition of Qualifications Obtained in Foreign Higher Education Institutions".

1.2 This Regulation defines the procedure for holding competitions for participation in academic mobility programs, requirements for participants in the competitive selection for participation in academic mobility programs, criteria for determining the winners of competitions for participation in academic mobility programs for participants in the educational process of the University and the procedure for appealing the results of the competitive selection.

1.3 **The purpose of** the competitive selection is to select candidates for participation in the academic mobility program from among the participants of the educational process on the basis of the submitted documents in compliance with the principles of openness and objectivity.

1.4 Participants in the educational process of the University are allowed to participate in academic mobility programs. Participants **of the educational** process of the University are:

- students of higher education;
- PhD **students** (hereinafter referred to **as doctoral students**);
- academic and other staff of the University's structural units (hereinafter referred to as

staff).

Higher education students include:

- **students** - persons enrolled in the University to obtain a bachelor's or master's degree;
- **postgraduate students** - persons enrolled in the University to obtain a doctorate degree.

1.5 In order to **exercise the right** to academic mobility, the University and a foreign higher education institution (research institution) or another Ukrainian higher education institution (research institution) or organization (hereinafter referred to as **partner institutions**) **conclude an agreement** in writing or electronically on the implementation of the academic mobility program (hereinafter referred to as **the partnership** agreement).

1.6 **The right** to academic mobility can also be exercised by participants in the educational process of the University **on their own initiative** (initiative mobility), subject to a positive decision of the Rector, made on the basis of a submission and an individual invitation from a partner institution. In this case,

the future participant of the academic mobility program does not participate in the competition.

1.7 Participation in the academic mobility program is possible provided that it **corresponds** to the educational program in which the higher education student is studying or the field of activity of the academic staff / other participant in the educational process at the University (except for language internships).

1.8 Participation in the competitive selection is not possible for:

- persons temporarily admitted to educational classes;
- listeners;
- higher education students on academic leave;
- participants of the educational process of the University who are sent abroad by the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine (MESU) for study, internships, pedagogical, scientific and pedagogical, and scientific work to implement international agreements on cooperation in education and/or science.

2. The procedure for conducting competitions for participation y academic mobility

2.1 Competitive selection among the participants of the educational process of the University is carried out within the framework of the implementation of bilateral academic mobility programs by the University and partner institutions in academic mobility programs.

2.2 The main principles of the competition are fairness, transparency, equal opportunities for all participants and accessibility.

2.3 All information and documentation about the competition: mobility parameters, terms, conditions of the competition and selection criteria are posted on the website of the International Relations Office (IRO) and on IRO's social media pages.

2.4 The terms of the competition: the period for submitting applications, reviewing applications by the competition committee, and the date of the results announcement are set by IRO based on the requirements of the partner institution.

2.5 The tender announcement, which specifies the terms and conditions of the tender and selection criteria, is published on the official website of IRO and on IRO's social media pages.

2.6 The application form and submission of the application by the participant of the educational process of the University is carried out electronically to the IRO e-mail address within the established time limits and in accordance with the requirements specified in the announcement. IRO specialists examine the application packages for compliance with the selection criteria. Documents that do not meet the requirements or are submitted after the deadline will not be accepted.

2.7 IRO enters a tender that meets the established requirements into the tender database; assigns a code to it to protect the participant's personal data.

2.8 Based on the results of the review of the submitted packages of documents, IRO forms a rating table, which is submitted to the tender committee for consideration along with

packages of documents for making a decision on the winners of the competition.

2.9 The procedure for competitive selection of participants in the academic mobility program at the University level is carried out by the competition commission (hereinafter - the Commission) in the following composition: Vice-Rector for Scientific and Pedagogical Work, responsible for international activities, academic mobility coordinator of the University, representatives of the International Relations Office, academic mobility coordinators of the (relevant) faculties, representatives of student self-government. The composition of the competition commission may be supplemented by other participants depending on the terms of the academic mobility program. The chairman of the Commission is the Vice-Rector for Scientific and Pedagogical Work, the deputy chairman is the coordinator of academic mobility of the University. Members of the Commission who have a conflict of interest in a particular project do not participate in the work of the Commission.

2.10 Based on the conclusions of the Commission, the main and reserve lists of candidates recommended for participation in the academic mobility program are drawn up. The decisions of the Commission are formalized in a protocol.

2.11 The IRO informs the participants and the partner institution about the results of the competitive selection by e-mail; sends the information to the academic mobility coordinators of the partner institutions and posts the results of the selection (with partially encoded data) on the IRO website and on the IRO's social media pages.

2.12 After the selection results are announced and all the necessary documents are received, the IRO sends a letter of nomination to the relevant partner institution and a copy to the candidate. The academic mobility coordinator of the partner institution contacts the nominee to issue an invitation and obtain all necessary information.

2.13 If, according to the terms of the competition, the decision to determine the winner(s) of the competition is made by the partner institution, the Commission determines the nominees from the University and submits the relevant list to the partner institution for the final decision.

2.14 Already selected candidates for the academic mobility program submit a package of documents in paper form to the IRO and draw up the necessary documents for referral to the academic mobility program in accordance with the requirements and deadlines set by the partner institution.

2.15 After receiving an invitation from a partner institution, the candidate applies for a visa for travel and at least 10 days before departure applies to the International Relations Office to issue an order from the rector to send the participant of the University's educational process to participate in the academic mobility program.

3. Requirements for participants of the competitive selection for participation in academic mobility programs

3.1 The following participants of the educational process of the University may participate in the competitive selection:

- applicants for the first (bachelor's) level of higher education (after completion of the first year or, if justified by the department, starting from the second semester of study);
- applicants for the second (master's) level of higher education (except for the last semester of study);
- applicants for the third educational and scientific level of higher education - graduate students (except for the last year of study);
- doctoral degree candidates;
- staff.

3.2 Participants of the University's educational process who apply to participate in the academic mobility competition must meet the following requirements:

for students:

- first (bachelor's) level of higher education - successful completion of the first year of study (possible after the first semester if justified by the department);
- the second (master's) level of higher education - studying in the first year of a master's degree (possibly in the second year, except for the last semester of study);
- the student's specialty must correspond to the program of study at the partner institution;
- the average grade point average should be between 3.75 and 5.00 points on a four-point grading scale;
- no academic or financial debts;
- proficiency in a foreign language at a level not lower than that required by the relevant partner institution and specified in the agreement on the implementation of the academic mobility program between the partner institutions. Language competence is confirmed by an appropriate certificate indicating the level of language proficiency or other document acceptable for participation in the academic mobility program (only for international academic mobility);

for postgraduate students:

- studying in the first to third year of postgraduate studies at the University;
- the average grade point average in the disciplines of the educational component of the program must be in the range of 3.75 to 5.00 points on a four-point grading scale;
- no academic or financial debts;
- the topic of scientific research should correspond to the topic of the dissertation / list of priority areas of education and science (in case of referral for a scientific internship);
- availability of scientific articles published in foreign, international and domestic professional journals, patents (in case of an internship);
- Participation in foreign, international and domestic scientific and practical conferences, symposia (in case of an internship);
- proficiency in a foreign language at a level not lower than that required by the relevant partner institution and specified in the agreement on the implementation of the academic mobility program between the partner institutions.

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Language competence is confirmed by an appropriate certificate indicating the level of language proficiency or other document acceptable for participation in the academic mobility program (only for international academic mobility);

for doctoral students:

- a PhD degree and at least three years of scientific or teaching experience, including at least one year at the University;
- the subject of the research should correspond to the list of priority areas of education and science;
- scientific articles published in foreign, international and domestic professional journals, patents;
- participation in foreign, international and domestic scientific and practical conferences and symposia;
- no disciplinary sanctions (if the doctoral student works at the University);
- proficiency in a foreign language at a level not lower than that required by the relevant partner institution and specified in the agreement on the implementation of the academic mobility program between the partner institutions. Language competence is confirmed by an appropriate certificate indicating the level of language proficiency or other document acceptable for participation in the academic mobility program (only for international academic mobility);

for academic staff:

- the topic of scientific research should correspond to the topic of the dissertation / list of priority areas of education and science (in case of referral for a scientific internship);
- availability of scientific articles published in foreign, international and domestic professional journals, patents (in case of an internship);
- Participation in foreign, international and domestic scientific and practical conferences, symposia (in case of an internship);
- proficiency in a foreign language at a level not lower than that required by the relevant partner institution and specified in the agreement on the implementation of the academic mobility program between the partner institutions. Language competence is confirmed by an appropriate certificate indicating the level of language proficiency or other document acceptable for participation in the academic mobility program (only for international academic mobility);
- the subject matter of the academic mobility program should correspond to the subject matter of the disciplines taught;
- no disciplinary sanctions;

for staff of structural units:

- the subject matter of the academic mobility program should correspond to the subject matter of the staff's activities;
- proficiency in a foreign language at a level not lower than that required by the relevant partner institution and specified in the agreement on the implementation of the academic mobility program between the partner institutions.

Language competence is confirmed by an appropriate certificate indicating the level of language proficiency or other document acceptable for participation in the academic mobility program (only for international academic mobility);

- no disciplinary sanctions.

3.3. To participate in the competition, participants in the University's educational process must submit the following documents to the International Relations Department by the deadline:

for undergraduate students:

- CV (Europass format);
- an extract from the individual curriculum with grades and credits in each discipline for the period of study, certified by the dean's office, ***for bachelors and masters;***
- a copy of the bachelor's degree with its supplement - ***for masters*** (in case of participation in the mobility in the first semester);
- a motivation letter;
- a copy of the certificate confirming the knowledge of a foreign language not lower than the level specified in the agreement or terms of the program (competition, project) (preference will be given to official international certificates). If you do not have a certificate, you must provide a Language Proficiency Assessment Form (*Appendix A*) certified by the Head of the Department of Foreign Languages (for international academic mobility only);
- a copy of the first page of the passport;

for postgraduate students:

- CV (Europass format);
- a motivation letter;
- an extract from the individual curriculum with grades and credits in each discipline for the period of study, certified by the Head of the Graduate School, indicating the absence or presence of academic and financial debts;
- a copy of the certificate confirming the knowledge of a foreign language not lower than the level specified in the agreement or terms of the program (competition, project) (preference will be given to official international certificates). If you do not have a certificate, you must submit a Language Proficiency Assessment Form certified by the Head of the Department of Foreign Languages (for international academic mobility only);
- a copy of the first page of the passport;

for doctoral students:

- CV (*Europass format*);
- a motivation letter;
- a copy of the certificate confirming the level of foreign language proficiency;
- a copy of the first page of the passport;
- information on the points received for the research paper, taking into account the criteria given in *Table B.1 of Appendix B*;

- information on the absence of disciplinary sanctions;

for staff:

- CV (*Europass format*);
- motivation letter;
- a copy of the certificate confirming the knowledge of a foreign language;
- plan mobility plan for teaching/internship mobility plan (Mobility Agreement for Teaching/Training) (if there is such a requirement of the academic mobility program);
- the staff's rating for the last five years and the points received for scientific work, taking into account the criteria set out in *Table B.1 of Appendix B*;
- information on the absence of disciplinary sanctions;
- a copy of the first page of the passport.

Note: In case of international academic mobility CV and motivation letter are submitted in the appropriate foreign language.

3.4. Each student has the right to simultaneously participate in the competitive selection for no more than two programs.

3.5. The Commission takes into account whether the candidates belong to privileged categories of the population (orphans, people with disabilities, etc.). Such candidates enjoy priority in the selection process in case of equal competition with other applicants.

3.6. The list of documents accompanying the academic mobility of participants in the educational process of the University, their form and content in each case may be changed in accordance with the requirements of the partner institution or the conditions of participation in the program.

4. Criteria for determining the winners of competitions for participation in academic mobility programs for participants in the educational process of the University

4.1. The winner in the competition for the right to participate in academic mobility is the **higher education student** who scored more points than other participants in the competition based on the following criteria:

4.1.1. Academic performance (maximum 30 points) is evaluated based on the overall grade point average obtained during the bachelor's and/or master's degree or postgraduate studies (Table 1).

Points are calculated by IRO specialists on the basis of extracts from individual curricula with grades and disciplines certified by the dean or head of the graduate school.

4.1.2. Foreign language proficiency (maximum 30 points) see Table 2. It is assessed on the basis of an official certificate or other official document (Language Proficiency Assessment Form, LPAF, see Appendix A) containing information on the level of foreign language proficiency specified in the agreement between the partner institutions in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Internationally recognized certificates of language competence (TOEFL, IELTS, FCE/CAE and PTE, TestDaF, Goethe-Zertifikate, DSDI or II, DELF/DALF, DELE, PLIDA, etc.) provide double the number of points for the corresponding level of language proficiency. B1 level - 5 points; B2 level - 10 points; C1/C2 level - 15 points. The presence of a Language Proficiency Assessment Form confirming the level of foreign language proficiency B1 is worth **1 point, B2 - 2 points and C1-C2 - 3 points.**

Criteria for assessing the language competence of participants in the educational process of the University.

4.1.3. Academic profile (maximum 10 points). Qualitative assessment of CV items:

- (CV), compiled in the form Europass: level of professional competence/work experience in the specialty (1 point);
- Experience of intercultural communications, in particular, participation y international schools, conferences, trainings, etc. (2 points);

- active participation in educational, scientific, social or other socially useful activities (1 point);
- availability of certificates, diplomas, diplomas, etc. for the period of study at the University (1 point);
- participation (prize-winning place) in competitions, competitions of innovative projects, scientific works in the specialty during the period of study at the University (in all-Ukrainian competitions and projects - 1 point, in international competitions and projects - 2 points);
- participation in the second stage of the competition for participation in academic mobility (2 points).

4.1.4. Motivation letter (maximum 10 points). Qualitative assessment of the motivation letter (5 points): logic, consistency and literacy; desire for professional development; justification of the feasibility of participation in the mobility program for the applicant and the University; presentation of the motivation letter at the interview (5 points).

4.1.5. If two or more applicants for higher education have scored the same number of competitive points, preference is given to the applicant with a higher grade point average and a higher level of language competence. If two or more applicants of the third educational and scientific level of higher education have scored the same number of points, preference is given to the applicant with an existing letter of support; the second criterion is the rating score for the research plan, the third is language competence.

4.1.6. Re-participation in the Erasmus+ program is possible at the same level of study on the condition of a "zero grant" or with partial/full coverage of expenses. The maximum period of participation in the Erasmus+ program is 12 months. Repeated participation in the competition reduces the priority of the participant by 10 points.

4.2. The winner in the competition for the right to participate in academic mobility among ***academic and other staff of the University's structural units*** is the person who scored more points than other participants in the competition based on the following criteria:

4.2.1. Academic profile (maximum 10 points). Qualitative assessment of the positions of the CV, drawn up in the Europass form:

- structured and detailed document (2 points); level of professional competence (1 point);
- availability of developed and implemented English-language courses (1 point);
- personal and leadership qualities, experience in intercultural communications (2 points);
- active participation in educational, scientific, public or other social useful activity (4 points).

4.2.2. The research work of the participants of the educational University from among the research and teaching staff of the University participating in the competitive selection shall be evaluated according to the indicators given in Table B.1 of Appendix B.

4.2.3. Knowledge of a foreign language (maximum 30 points). It is assessed on the basis of an official certificate or other official document (Language Proficiency Assessment Form) containing information about the level of foreign language proficiency specified in the agreement between the partner institutions in accordance with the Common European

Framework of Reference for Languages. level B1 - 1 point, level B2 - 2 points, level C1/C2 - 3 points. Internationally recognized certificates of language competence provide double the number of points for the corresponding level of language proficiency.

4.2.4. The feasibility and motivation (maximum 3 points). Qualitative assessment of the motivation letter:

logic, consistency and completeness (1 point);

justification of the expediency of participation in the mobility program for the staff and for the University as a whole (1 point);

desire to work to achieve high results (1 point).

4.2.5. Mobility Agreement for Teaching/Training (maximum 3 points) (if required by the academic mobility program). Qualitative assessment of the mobility plan for teaching/training - 3 points.

4.2.6. Letter of support from a partner institution - 6 points.

4.2.7. If two or more staff have scored the same number of competitive points, preference is given to candidates with an existing letter of support, the second criterion is the rating score for the mobility plan for teaching/internship, and the third is language competence. Preference is also given to initiators of international agreements from faculties and structural units, as well as academic mobility coordinators at faculties (+5 points). Repeated participation in the Erasmus+ CA1 program within one academic year reduces the priority of the participant by 5 points.

5. The procedure for appealing the results of the competitive selection

5.1. The candidate has the right to appeal the decision of the Commission within three working days from the date of announcement of the selection results. The appeal shall be addressed to the Head of the Commission and submitted to the Secretary of the Commission. Within five business days, the Commission must consider the appeal and inform the candidate of the results by letter to the email address specified in the application. The Commission's decision based on the results of the appeal is final and not subject to review.

6. Final regulations

6.1.1. The Regulations on the procedure for competitive selection of participants in the educational process for participation in academic mobility programs at Khmelnytskyi National University are posted on the University's website (<https://khnmu.edu.ua/>): section - "Regulatory Documents", section - "Regulations", page - "Regulations on the Organization of Educational Activities".

6.1.2. This Regulation shall come into force from the moment of its approval by the order of the Chancellor of the University on the basis of the decision of the Academic Council of the University.

6.1.3. In the event of amendments or additions to the state regulatory legal documents governing the issues of this Regulation, the relevant clauses of the Regulation shall cease to be valid and the necessary changes shall be made instead, approved by the order of the Chancellor of University on the basis of a decision of the Academic Council of the University or the relevant advisory body.

Level	Description
A1	Can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type. Can introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has. Can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.
A2	Can understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment). Can communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters. Can describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.
B1	Can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. Can deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken. Can produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest. Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes & ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
B2	Can understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including technical discussions in his/her field of specialisation. Can interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party. Can produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects and explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options.
C1	Can understand a wide range of demanding, longer texts, and recognise implicit meaning. Can express him/herself fluently and spontaneously without much obvious searching for expressions. Can use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes. Can produce clear, well-structured, detailed text on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organisational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.
C2	Can understand with ease virtually everything heard or read. Can summarise information from different spoken and written sources, reconstructing arguments and accounts in a coherent presentation.
